NARRATOR

GILES

(clearing his throat)

NARRATOR

(adding, as if tossing him a bone)

And assistant manager. As well as the hotel's geriatric, if not downright Jurassic, bell captain, Cap. Cap is sitting on a ledge above the carnival's dunk tank.

CAP

"Ha ha."

(sighs)

Face it. I'm not good at improv. No. What's that thing that's like improv? Oh, yeah. Astronomy.

ABBY

Don't worry, Cap. I can never hit these targets.

(MORE)

ABBY (cont'd)

(aggressive)

Psych! I was the best pitcher the Omaha girl's softball league ever had! Take this!

SOUND: BALL WHIPPING THROUGH THE AIR.

SOUND: BALL STRIKING TARGET.

CAP

Whoa!

SOUND: THUD.

CAP (IN TANK)

Back in my day they used to put water in the dunk tank!

CARNIE

Sorry, mac. That's weird. I just filled it an hour ago.

WE OCCASIONALLY HEAR ${f CAP}$ CALLING OUT FOR HELP BEHIND THE FOLLOWING DIALOGUE.

GILES

I must say, Miss Falmacher, you seem to be slightly agitated today.

ABBY

Oh, it's this Brax Higgins business. His plan to take over the Little Wicker Basket Company nearly ruined the business.

GILES

And nearly got you killed!

ABBY

Yes, that, too. Thank goodness Kipper and Mulligan turned out to be so incompetent.

(sighs)

I'm afraid you're going to have to run the hotel alone for a bit, Giles. I have to go back to Pleasant View to try to right the wicker ship. Things are pretty bad at the moment.

GILES

How bad?

ABBY

I may have to start saying "Little Wicker Baskets -- they're almost everywhere.

GILES

Oh, my.

CAP (IN TANK)

Can someone get me a ladder?

ABBY

I'm just glad Higgins is in prison now.

CAP (IN TANK)

Or toss in a bunch of that cotton candy! so I can eat my way out?

ABBY

(not hearing CAP, she contiues on about HIGGINS)

Serves him right. I hope he's "enjoying" his life behind bars.

MUSIC: CALLIOPE MUSIC UP AND OUT.

CHAPTER 2, SCENE 2: INT. PRISON HALLWAY - DAY

NARRATOR

In a segue that actually makes sense, we turn our attention to the nearby town of Convenience, located South of Chasm Valley. Convenience has the dubious honor of playing host to the state's largest prison. This is a facility so cruel, it is often referred to simply as "The Cage". Disgraced former Little Wicker Baskets executive Brax Higgins is being escorted through the grungy, dimly lit halls of the prison by two guards.

SOUND: BUZZ OF UNBALANCED FLUORESCENT LIGHTS.

SOUND: MULTIPLE SETS OF FOOTSTEPS ON HARD FLOORING.

SOUND: CHAINS RATTLE WHENEVER HIGGINS MOVES.

SOUND: FOOTSTEPS STOP.

SOUND: KNOCK ON DOOR.

CHURR (THROUGH DOOR)

Come in.

SOUND: DOOR OPENS.

SOUND: MULTIPLE SETS OF FOOTSTEPS ON HARD FLOORING.

CHAPTER 2, SCENE 3: INT. WARDEN'S OFFICE - DAY

SOUND: FOOTSTEPS STOP.

GUARD

Here he is, Warden.

Warden Doctor Dewayne **CHURR** is extremely mild-mannered and finds it hard to assert himself. You would expect to find him working in an accounting firm, not a prison full of dangerous criminals. However, he seems to be a man on a mission.

HIGGINS is a bitter man. His fall from grace, trial and conviction has left him even angrier at everyone and everything. He thinks the world is chaos and that people have lost their ability to be polite. He does not see, of course, that he lacks a lot of the social graces. He is also a neat freak, always trying to stay clean and organized.

CHURR

Oh, yes. Hello, Mr. Higgins. I'm Warden Dr. Dewayne Churr. Welcome to Happy Meadows Maximum Security Prison.

HIGGINS

Happy Meadows? Don't you mean "The Cage"?

CHURR

(uncontrolled)

NO!

(regaining composure)

No. It's "Happy Meadows." You see, I think part of the problem with this prison is that it has a bad reputation.

HIGGINS

A prison? With a bad reputation? Somebody alert the media.

CHURR

That's what I'm talking about. When people hear the word "prison," they conjure up images of bars and chains and guns.

SOUND: CHAINS RATTLE.

HIGGINS

I can't imagine why.

CHURR

(excited to be talking about this)

Right? You see, by making some simple changes, I believe I can rehabilitate (MORE)

CHURR (cont'd)

not only our "guests," I can also fix the reputation of this whole prison. Giving it a new name is just an example. Still working on that one. It's all part of my vision.

HIGGINS

"Vision"?

CHURR

Why should prison be so...prison-y? My research says that if you want to reform people, you have to trust them.

MUSIC: "NOBODY BELIEVED ME" VAMP BEHIND DIALOGUE.

HIGGINS

And the people who hired you bought all that?

CHURR

Well, not exactly. I had to convince them. You see...

CHURR's personality totally changes during the song. This mission is his passion. He can be forceful, animated and dramatic while the music lasts.

CHURR (SINGING)

I heard all the wailing
How this prison was failing
I offered to take charge and make it
work

(MORE)

CHURR (SINGING) (cont'd)

Nobody would listen
My big plans for the prison
All I got from them was a great big
smirk.

HIGGINS

(speaking, only mildly interested)

Then what happened?

CHURR

(singing)

I said I'd...

Take incarceration

And flip it on its head

I mean why
Just serve out a sentence
Let's spread some cheer instead

For instance Nightly "guest" receptions Will lead to new friendships

It's hard to
Shiv your cellmate after
You've shared some three-bean dips

And when you
Want to get things moving
There's lifting weights, of course

But would you Choose that as your option If you could ride a horse?

HIGGINS

And then they hired you?

CHURR

(calmly, almost timid)

Not exactly.

CHURR (SINGING)

(boisterously and dramatic)

"You're mad!" they cried, Like I was Frankenstein "How sad!" they jeered They were so unkind

"But I," (said I),
"I've done all my research"
"Doc Churr, dear sir,
That isn't how it works"

I replied

Don't think it's all gloomy

And there's no room for glee

For instance
Solitary's lonely
Put two in there. Or Three!

Don't forget
That the prison guards here
Tend to intimidate

But what if
We had them use humor
Meant to self-deprecate?

And when it

Comes to trusting inmates

This place will raise the bar

(MORE)

CHURR (SINGING) (cont'd)

We'll shout out
"Stay inside your jail cells!"
Then keep the door ajar.

"Doc Churr! Get out!,"
They said -- no, <u>screamed</u> at me!
"Hey, wait," said I,
"I'll do the job for free!"

They paused, they talked
Then turned and smiled at me
"You have the job!
Despite your sad C.V."

(slowing down)

"Good luck with your pipe dream."

(big finish)

That is the true story
You got the whole tour
I think I've proved clearly
That one thing's for sure

If crime is a disease
If crime is a disease
If crime is a disease...
I. Am. D. Churr!
Churr!

SOUND: HIGGINS DOING SLOW-CLAP APPLAUSE, WITH THE SOUND OF HIS SHACKLES ACCOMPANYING EVERY MOVE OF HIS HANDS.

HIGGINS

(unimpressed)

You really want to make this place to feel like home? Just take off these dirty, filthy cuffs, open the front gate (MORE)

HIGGINS (cont'd)

and I'll walk off to get a pack of cigarettes and never come back.

CHURR

(sighs)

I can see you still don't get it. But you will! Now, you probably want to get settled. We're building an amazing open floor plan common sleeping area, but for now, space is tight. You'll be sharing a cell. I think you'll like your roommate. He's rather...unique.

SOUND: TRANSITION WHOOSH.

CHAPTER 2, SCENE 4: INT. INMATE CELL - SMASH CUT

GUARD

Here you go. I'll let you two get acquainted. And I hope you like music.

SOUND: CELL DOOR SLIDES SHUT.

HIGGINS

Rude! And dusty.

HIGGINS' CELLMAE MAKES A SOUND THAT CATCHES HIGGINS ATTENTION.

HIGGINS (cont'd)

(cautiously, apprehensive)

Uh. Hello. My name is Brax Higgins. Who are you? And please tell me that that the only bathroom in here?

BAD NOTE BILLY

(mumbles quietly)

They call me Bad...

HIGGINS

I'm sorry. I can't hear you. You need to speak up.

BAD NOTE BILLY

(excited and loud)

Oh. I can be louder!

(singing, badly, a
 cappella)

Oh! They call me Bad Note Billy.

I love to sing, it's what I do.

It's how I start each day.

And end them the same way.

I tried to kill someone, did you?
